Message from your local Inspector, Ed Brown

Three males were arrested recently following a burglary in Sculthorpe. They had managed to make off with a couple of motorbikes but these were thankfully recovered. The investigation is ongoing. Several criminal damages have been reported to motor vehicles on Wensum Way, Fakenham which is disappointing, if anyone has any information around this please contact us directly.

As part of the Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel priorities we have agreed to focus on increasing the visibility of policing in Fakenham. As part of this I was interviewed by Matt Farmer from Fakenham and Wells Times on Facebook Live talking about local policing. For anyone who missed this it is available on the Enjoy Fakenham More Facebook page or, indeed, on the North Norfolk Police Facebook account. We are aiming to put out a lot more content around what we are doing because believe it there are over 30 police officers who work from Fakenham Police Station across the week serving this community. Whilst the Public Enquiry Officer closed last year the station is still very active and, indeed, growing. Next month we welcome 4 more new officers so we'll look to get them out into the community as soon as possible. Please do say hello!

Crime Updates (1st to 30th September 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	3	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	14	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	9	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	4	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
